Community Outreach: Strengthening our ties with the broader Flower Mound area through local service projects.

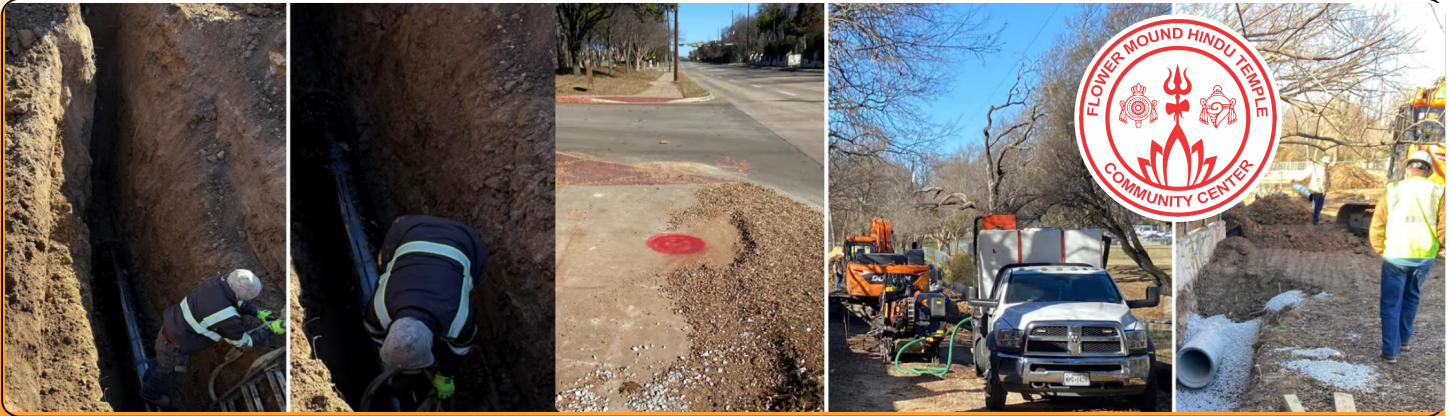
How you can Participate:

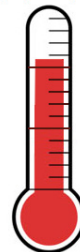

## Operational & Puja Committee Update

On January 1st, FMHT experienced a significant increase in devotee participation, with approximately 800 devotees visiting the temple to begin the New Year with prayers and blessings.

FMHT has also witnessed a notable increase in youth volunteer participation in 2026, reflecting the growing involvement of the younger generation in temple services and community initiatives. Operational revenue continues to remain stable and well managed.

### Saibaba Bhajans Initiative:

Beginning January 2026, FMHT launched the Saibaba Bhajans program at devotees' residences as part of its outreach and spiritual engagement efforts. Bhajans were conducted on January 9, 11, and 22. Over 25 families expressed interest in hosting, and bhajans were held at three homes during this initial phase. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Sachin ji's family, Ananda ji, and Krishna ji for taking the lead and selflessly hosting and conducting the bhajans at devotees' homes. Their dedication and seva have played a vital role in making this initiative deeply meaningful and spiritually enriching. Encouraged by the overwhelming response, this program will continue in the coming months, and the team will reach out to devotees to schedule upcoming bhajans.

## Support the New Temple Through Stock & DAF Giving

As we continue building our sacred temple, devotees can support this divine effort in a simple and tax-efficient way by donating appreciated stocks or through a Donor-Advised Fund (DAF) often allowing you to give more than cash. Example: Donating Appreciated Stock

Suppose you purchased AAPL (Apple) stock for \$500 several years ago, and today it is worth \$2,500. If you sell the stock first, you may owe capital gains tax on the \$2,000 gain.

If you donate the stock directly:

- The temple receives the full \$2,500 toward construction
- You may avoid capital gains tax on the \$2,000 appreciation
- You may receive a charitable tax deduction for the full \$2,500

This often results in significant tax savings, while maximizing your impact.

How to donate appreciated stock:

- Visit DonateStock
- Search for Flower Mound Hindu Temple
- Select AAPL (or TSLA), enter the number of shares, and complete the secure transfer

Using a Donor-Advised Fund (DAF):

If you have a DAF with Fidelity, Vanguard, or Schwab, you may recommend a grant directly to the temple.

## A Beacon of Truth, Strength, and Devotion



Sri Madhvacharya (1238 AD – 1317 AD)

Sri Madhvacharya (1238 AD – 1317 AD) stands among the greatest spiritual teachers of Bharat, alongside Adi Shankaracharya and Ramanujacharya. Born as Vasudeva on the auspicious day of Vijaya Dashami (Dussehra) in 1238 AD at Pajaka near Udupi, Karnataka, he went on to establish the profound philosophy of Dvaita Vedanta (Tattvavada).

From a young age, Madhvacharya displayed exceptional intelligence, spiritual depth, and physical strength. He taught that God, the soul, and the world are all real, and that the universe is not an illusion but a purposeful creation of God. According to him, the world is a divine school where humanity learns God's greatness while fulfilling its duties with humility and devotion.

A central pillar of Madhvacharya's teaching was spiritual inclusiveness. He emphasized that the Supreme Being is one and may be worshipped by any name and in any language. True devotion transcends external differences. He also challenged rigid social divisions, asserting that spiritual worth is determined by one's nature and conduct not by birth or caste an advanced and courageous message for the 13th century.

As a monk, philosopher, and reformer, Madhvacharya traveled extensively across India, including three journeys to Badari. He authored nearly forty influential works, including commentaries on the Bhagavad Gita, Upanishads, Brahma Sutras, Mahabharata, and Bhagavata Purana. He established Udupi as a major center of devotion by installing Lord Sri Krishna there and guiding the formation of the eight Ashta Mathas.

According to the Sri Hari Vayu Stuti, composed by Sri Trivikrama Panditacharya, Madhvacharya is revered as the third avatara of Lord Vayu, manifesting as Hanuman,

Bhima, and Madhwa across the yugas, symbolizing unwavering devotion, strength, and righteousness.

Madhwa Navami, observed on January 27, 2026, marks the sacred occasion when Sri Madhvacharya concluded his earthly mission and proceeded from the Ananteshwara Temple in Udupi to Badarikashrama. Devotees honor this day by reflecting on his timeless teachings and renewing their commitment to truth, devotion, and dharma

## Finding Inner Peace on the Night of the New Moon

The Hindu festival Maha Shivratri is the night when Lord Shiva, the destroyer of evil, marries Mata Parvati. This year on the auspicious night of February 15 to the morning of February 16, Hindus celebrate Maha Shrivarthri to worship Lord Shiva on his marriage day. During this occasion, Hindus keep fasts and have pujas, like Abishakem, to honor Lord Shiva. Abishakem is the puja where devotees use milk, honey, water, and bilva leaves to offer to Lord Shiva.

We celebrate Maha Shivratri on a new moon night, or Amavasya. The new moon occurs when the Sun, Earth and moon are all in alignment, making the moon appear invisible to the naked eye. In the Hindu culture, this dark night symbolizes letting go of negativity and focusing on yourself to find inner peace.

As a community, we come together in prayer, to celebrate Maha Shivratri to worship Lord Shiva and to strengthen our bonds between one another and towards our culture.

# Employer Matching Contributions

Employer contribution matches for religious or charitable organizations typically depend on the specific policies of the employer's matching gift program. Here's an overview of how it usually works:

1. Check Eligibility
  - Employers usually provide a list of eligible organizations or categories, such as religious, educational, or nonprofit organizations. Some employers exclude religious organizations unless the donation is for non-religious activities like community outreach or education.
2. Donation by the Employee
  - The employee makes a personal donation to a qualifying religious or charitable organization, like a Hindu temple.
  - The donation amount should meet the employer's minimum requirements (e.g., \$25).
3. Submit Matching Gift Request
  - The employee submits a matching gift request through the company's platform or by filling out a matching gift form.
  - This could include: The donation receipt.
  - Information about the organization (e.g., tax-exempt status like 501(c)(3) in the U.S.).
  - Some companies use platforms like Benevity or Double the Donation to manage these requests.
4. Employer Verification
  - The employer verifies whether the organization and donation meet their eligibility criteria.
  - If approved, the employer matches the donation, usually up to a specified limit (e.g., \$1,000 annually).
5. Funds Disbursed
  - Once approved, the matching amount is sent directly to the organization by the employer.

## Important Considerations

- Tax-Exempt Status: Most employers require the organization to have a recognized charitable status, like 501(c)(3) in the U.S.
- Restrictions on Religious Use: Some employers restrict matching to non-religious purposes, like community services or educational programs offered by the religious organization.
- Annual Caps: Employers often have an annual maximum they will match per employee.

To ensure the temple qualifies and the match is successful, check with your HR or your employer's matching gift policy.

# Sacred Sounds

Sacred Sounds for Young Yogis had a wonderful restart in January 2026 after the two-week winter break, with our children returning full of enthusiasm and focus.

- Sixteen Bala Upāsaka have already learned 26 ślokas, completing over 50% of this year’s syllabus a remarkable milestone at this stage of the year.
- Twelve Bala Sādhaka joyfully began learning their favorite Śrī Hanumān Cālīsā, bringing great energy and devotion into the classroom.
- In Gītā Yajñā, 22 children earned their “Gītā Guñjanā” certification for their perfect recitation of Bhakti Yoga and Puruṣottama Yoga, as assessed by Gītā Pariwār.

Beyond the classroom, our children also enthusiastically participated in the Sankranti Rangoli celebrations at the Hindu Temple, adding color, creativity, and festivity to the occasion

On January 25, in light of the winter storm, our classrooms were moved online as an exception. Despite the conditions, 40+ children attended across three online classrooms, demonstrating wonderful commitment and continuity in learning.

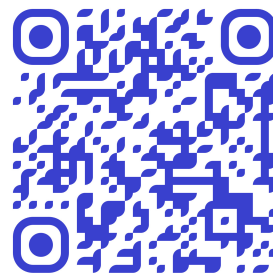
In January 2026, children from the Gita Yajña classroom appeared for the “Gita Guñjana” certification assessments. They were evaluated on Bhakti Yoga and Puruṣottama Yoga, focusing on Uccharaṇa (pronunciation) and Saṃskṛtam Vyakaraṇa (grammar). We’re delighted to share that 22 children cleared the assessments with flying colors. Here are some of those smiling faces that reflect their hard work and dedication

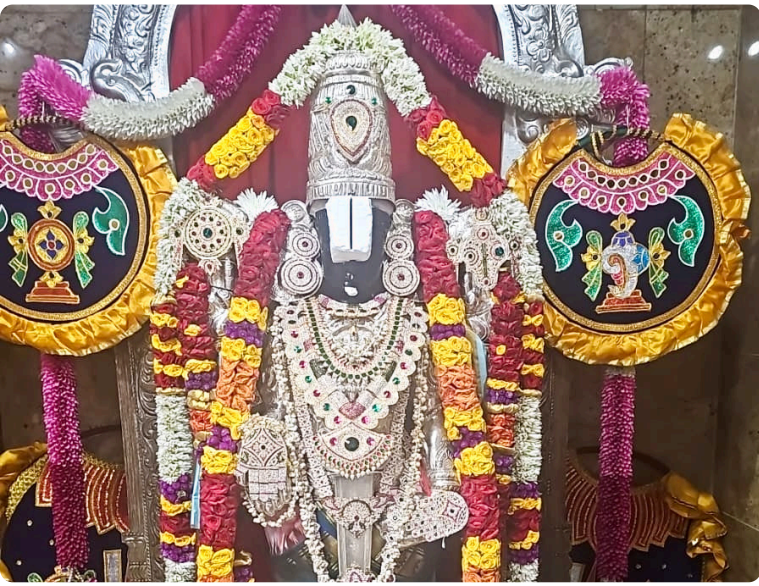

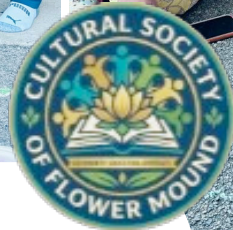

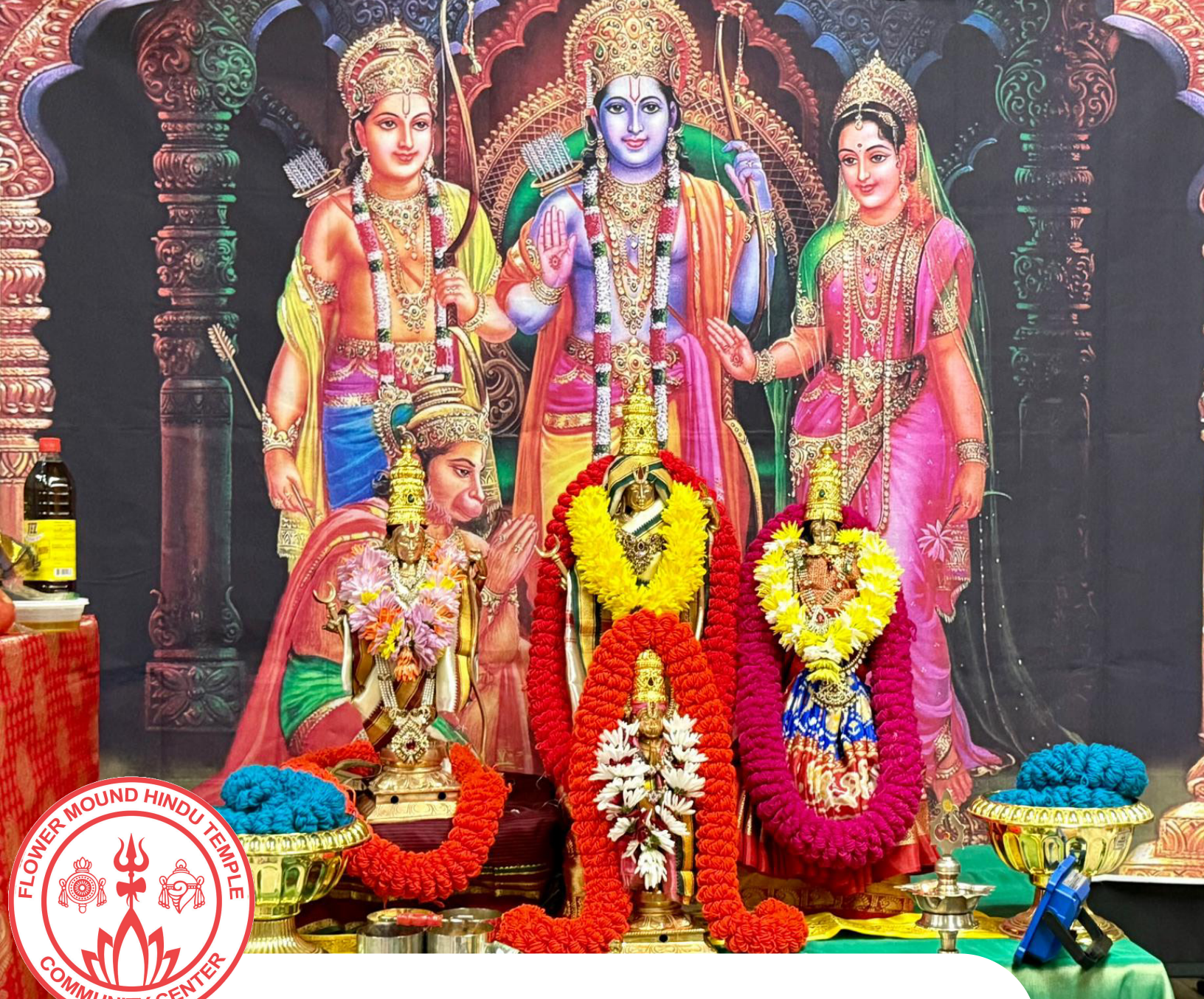
