What began as vision and planning has now blossomed into visible on-site construction, bringing our collective dream closer to reality than ever before.

Suppose you purchased AAPL (Apple) stock for \$500 several years ago, and today it is worth \$2,500. If you sell the stock first, you may owe capital gains tax on the \$2,000 gain.

The temple receives the full \$2,500 toward construction

You may avoid capital gains tax on the \$2,000 appreciation

You may receive a charitable tax deduction for the full \$2,500

## Significant Hindu Festivals in the month of May

**11th Monday:** Visakha Bahula Dasami: Hanuman Jayanti is celebrated in Telugu calendar to mark the birth of Lord Hanuman, a revered Hindu deity known as the avatar of Lord Shiva, symbolizing strength, devotion, and selfless service. Devotees honor his devotion to Lord Rama and seek blessings for courage, protection, and success.

**Key Reasons for Celebration:** Celebrating Divine Birth: It marks the birth of Hanuman to Anjana and Kesari, with the blessing of Vayu (the wind god).

**Honoring Devotion and Strength:** Hanuman is the ultimate symbol of selfless service and unflinching devotion (bhakti) to Lord Rama.

**Symbol of Wisdom and Power:** Devotees worship him to gain physical strength, mental fortitude, and wisdom, often chanting the Hanuman Chalisa for protection.

**Removal of Obstacles:** He is considered Sankatmochan (remover of dangers) and a destroyer of bad astrological influences, especially for those worshipping him on Saturdays.

**Significance:** Virtue and Discipline: Hanuman symbolizes total surrender (ego removal) and discipline, which followers aim to emulate in their own lives.

**Cultural Tradition:** It is widely celebrated across India and among Hindus worldwide, particularly by wrestlers and athletes, who view him as a patron deity.

**17th Sunday:** Adhika Jyestha Month starts: Adhika Jyeshtham (or Adhik Maas) is an extra, intercalary month in the 2026 Hindu lunar calendar, spanning from May 17 to June 15, 2026. Dedicated to Lord Vishnu (Purushottam Maas), it is a highly sacred period for spiritual practices like meditation, fasting, and charity to align the lunar year with the solar calendar.

**Key Aspects of Adhika Jyeshtham 2026 Duration:** The month starts on May 17, 2026, and ends on June 15, 2026.

**Significance:** It is considered a holy month, often called Purushottam Maas, and is deemed excellent for removing sins and bringing divine blessings.

**Rituals:** Devotees perform Japam (chanting), Homam (fire rituals), Danam (charity), and Vrats (fasting).

**Avoidance:** While spiritual acts are encouraged, auspicious ceremonies such as weddings, housewarmings, or thread ceremonies are generally not performed during this intercalary month.

**Purnima Date:** The Adhika Jyeshtha Purnima (full moon) is highly significant, with rituals often performed on May 31, 2026.

This extra month occurs approximately every 32-33 months to align the 354-day lunar year with the 365-day solar year

• **Participate:** I humbly request all of you to join us for every temple event. Your presence is what breathes life into our community.

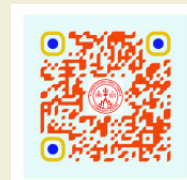

## Hanuman Jayanti

Hanuman Jayanti is an auspicious festival that celebrates the birth of Lord Hanuman, the monkey god revered for his strength, wisdom and devotion to Lord Rama. It symbolizes Hanuman as strength and courage and also his ultimate devotion and service to Lord Ram. It is generally celebrated in the months of March and April and observed on the full moon day. In some traditions Hanuman Jayanti is celebrated twice a year.

During this festival, devotees recite the Hanuman Chalisa and offer prayers to Hanuman. Many devotees also fast on this day. The idol of Hanuman is decorated with red flowers and sindoor. Overall, this festival is a reminder of Hanuman's unwavering loyalty to Lord Ram and his great courage.

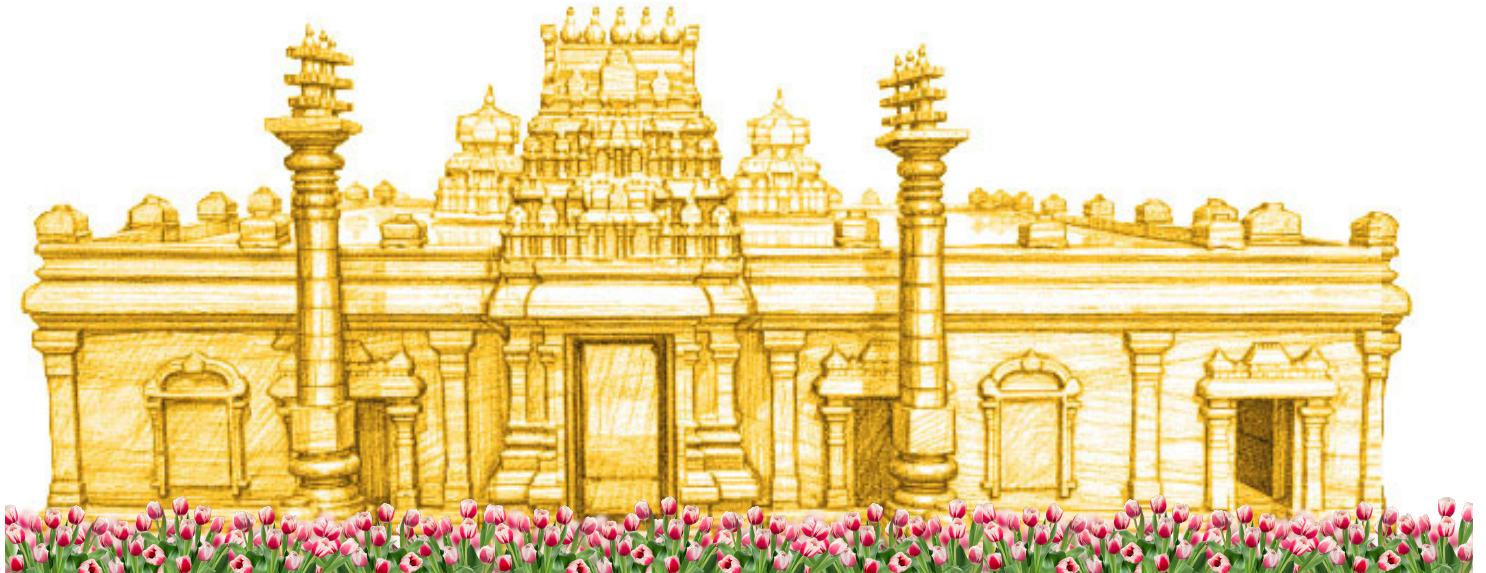

### The Annual Puja/Ishta Devata Puja Please scan this QR code



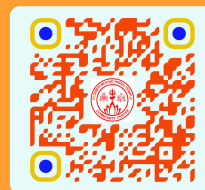

# Employer Matching Contributions

Employer contribution matches for religious or charitable organizations typically depend on the specific policies of the employer's matching gift program. Here's an overview of how it usually works:

1. Check Eligibility
  - Employers usually provide a list of eligible organizations or categories, such as religious, educational, or nonprofit organizations. Some employers exclude religious organizations unless the donation is for non-religious activities like community outreach or education.
2. Donation by the Employee
  - The employee makes a personal donation to a qualifying religious or charitable organization, like a Hindu temple.
  - The donation amount should meet the employer's minimum requirements (e.g., \$25).
3. Submit Matching Gift Request
  - The employee submits a matching gift request through the company's platform or by filling out a matching gift form.
  - This could include: The donation receipt.
  - Information about the organization (e.g., tax-exempt status like 501(c)(3) in the U.S.).
  - Some companies use platforms like Benevity or Double the Donation to manage these requests.
4. Employer Verification
  - The employer verifies whether the organization and donation meet their eligibility criteria.
  - If approved, the employer matches the donation, usually up to a specified limit (e.g., \$1,000 annually).
5. Funds Disbursed
  - Once approved, the matching amount is sent directly to the organization by the employer.

## Important Considerations

- Tax-Exempt Status: Most employers require the organization to have a recognized charitable status, like 501(c)(3) in the U.S.
- Restrictions on Religious Use: Some employers restrict matching to non-religious purposes, like community services or educational programs offered by the religious organization.
- Annual Caps: Employers often have an annual maximum they will match per employee.

To ensure the temple qualifies and the match is successful, check with your HR or your employer's matching gift policy.

# Sacred Sounds

|| Hari Om - Jai Shree Krishna ||

April is always a whirlwind month with children preparing for their STAAR exams and year-end school activities. Our classrooms kept pace with this energy, building on the momentum to complete the syllabus for the academic year and conduct assessments.



In April 2026, the Bala Upāsaka children completed learning a meaningful set of śloka that guide their daily routine and inner development from Brahmārpaṇam and Aham Vaiśvānaro (before meals), to Asato Mā Sadgamaya (transformation) and Tvameva Mātā Ca (dedication), Karacaraṇa kṛtaṃ and Rāma Skandhaṃ (before sleep), and finally Kāyena Vācā (forgiveness) and Om Sarve Bhavantu (harmony), reinforcing values of gratitude, reflection, and universal well-being. The Upāsaka kids did so while playing their favorite quizzes and winning cool rewards

The Bala Sādhaka children completed learning of the Nirvana Shatakam, while having a lot of fun solving Shiva puzzles in record time. They then began learning select stanzas from the powerful Mahiṣāsura Mardini Stotram, deepening their connection with Devī upāsana.



The Gītā Yajña Adhyāyī not only completed the classroom learning of the Uchhāraṇa (pronunciation), Vyākaraṇa (Grammar), and Vivechana (Meaning) aspects of Daivāsura-sampad-vibhāga Yoga, but also appeared for the Level 2 Gītā Jijñāsu assessment conducted by Geeta Pariwar.

I wanted to share a truly special and proud moment for all of us.

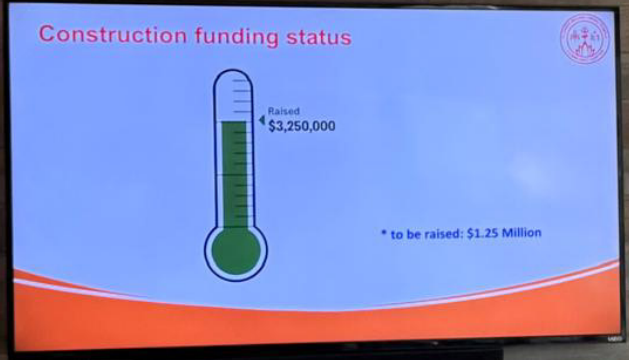

- Young Yogis chanting on Gītā Jayanti. **-(starts directly at Geeta Pariwar USA segment).**

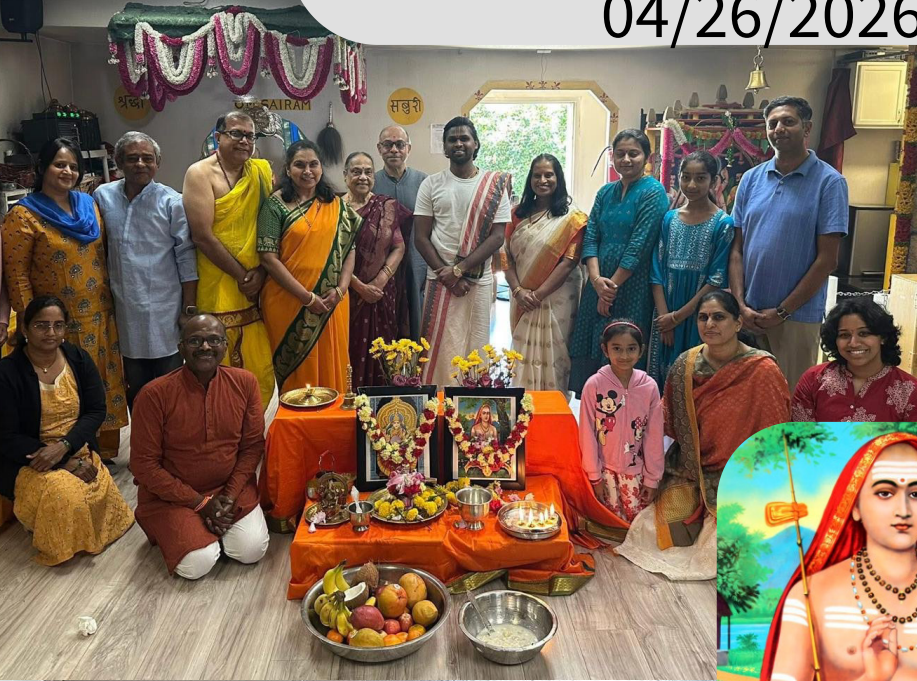
By the anugraha of Śrī Kṛṣṇa, our children’s journey of living the Bhagavad Gītā has reached Kurukshetra, from where it started

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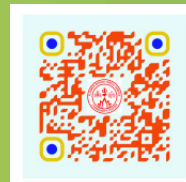
