What began as vision and planning has now blossomed into visible on-site construction, bringing our collective dream closer to reality than ever before.

Suppose you purchased AAPL (Apple) stock for \$500 several years ago, and today it is worth \$2,500. If you sell the stock first, you may owe capital gains tax on the \$2,000 gain.

The temple receives the full \$2,500 toward construction

You may avoid capital gains tax on the \$2,000 appreciation

You may receive a charitable tax deduction for the full \$2,500

Significant Hindu Festivals in the month of June

5th June, Friday:

Nija Jyeshtha Month starts. This month is auspicious. Muhurthams will be available for marriages, thread marriages etc.

Jyeshtha month is a highly sacred month in the Hindu calendar, occurring during the peak of summer. It is revered as a time for intense spiritual purification, penance, and charity, with practices focusing on water conservation, sun worship, and honoring life and nature.

Spiritual Merit: Scriptures like the Padma Purana state that spiritual efforts, fasts, and charity during Jyeshtha yield multiplied rewards.

Charity & Philanthropy: Because it is the hottest time of the year, donating water, earthen pitchers (matkas), fans, and cooling items is considered the highest form of seva (selfless service).

Worship Focus: The month is deeply dedicated to worshipping Surya Dev (the Sun God) for vitality, Lord Hanuman for strength, and Lord Vishnu/Lord Shiva for the well being.

29th June, Monday :

Jyeshtha Purnima (the full moon day in the Hindu lunar month of Jyeshtha, falling between May and June) is considered one of the most spiritually potent and auspicious Purnimas of the year.

Its significance spans marital devotion, ancestral blessings, and spiritual purification.

In Western and Southern states like Maharashtra, Gujarat, and Karnataka, Jyeshtha Purnima is celebrated as Vat Purnima (or Vat Savitri Vrat).

Satyanarayan Puja: Many households organize the Satyanarayan Katha and worship Lord Vishnu and Goddess Lakshmi to invite wealth, harmony, and abundance into their homes.

Chandra Arghya: The moon is at its peak of brightness and energy on this day. Devotees offer Arghya (water blended with milk and rice) to the Moon God in the evening to achieve emotional balance, mental clarity, and to soothe any astrological afflictions related to the moon.

This day is also considered an excellent time to honor one's ancestors. Performing Tarpana (offering water mixed with black sesame seeds) allows individuals to express gratitude to their lineage, seek forgiveness for past ancestral mistakes, and receive their spiritual blessings.

Every generation is given a unique opportunity to leave a legacy that outlasts them. For our community, that moment is now.

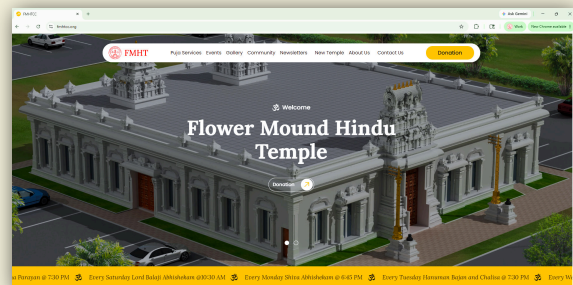

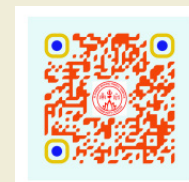

The Ultimate Test of Willpower: The Story and Significance of Nirjala Ekadashi

Have you ever tried going a whole day without looking at your phone? Now imagine going a whole day without drinking a single drop of water. This is exactly what people do on Nirjala Ekadashi, which is one of the toughest and most important religious fasts in Hindu culture. People fasting have to stop themselves from drinking water for the whole day.

The word Nirjala literally means without water. Out of the twenty four Ekadashis that happen throughout the year, this one is considered the most sacred and it is very significant to Hindus all around the world. It falls during the hot summer month of Jyeshtham which is usually May or June, which makes the no-water rule even harder. During these hotter days, drinking water is what most people would love but people who are fasting would have to sacrifice and stop themselves.

There is an interesting story behind it from the Mahabharata. Bhima, who was one of the Pandava brothers, loved food and he couldn't control his hunger to fast on the other Ekadashis. He felt really guilty about it, so he asked the sage Vyasa for help. Vyasa told him that if he kept just this one single fast perfectly, without eating or drinking anything for 24 hours, he would get the spiritual benefits of all twenty four Ekadashis combined. Bhima worked hard and tried his best and he actually managed to do it, which is why this day is also known as Bhima Ekadashi.

People who observe the fast can wake up early, pray to Lord Vishnu, and spend the day focusing on good vibes and meditation. Since it's all about sacrifice and helping others, people also donate clothes, food, and umbrellas to people in need. Water booths are even set up on the streets to give free, cold drinks to strangers.

To conclude, Nirjala Ekadashi is something that many Hindus do around the world and it requires a lot of dedication and sacrifices but it is worth it.

Instead of matching financial donations dollar-for-dollar, the employer matches hours-for-dollars.

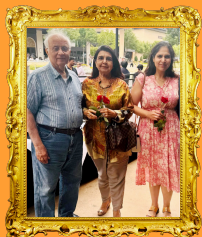
How It Works

- **Volunteerlocal:** You log hours volunteering at FMHTCC 501(c)3 nonprofit.
- **The Company Pays:** For every hour you give, your employer donates a set dollar amount
- **(for example, \$15 to \$25 per hour)** to that organization.
- **The Impact Doubles:** The nonprofit gets both your hands-on help and financial support, at zero cost to you.

It is a fantastic way for companies to encourage community service while allowing employees to direct corporate philanthropy toward causes they personally care about.

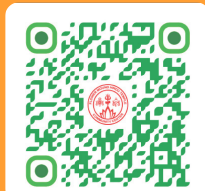

Employer Matching Contributions

Employer contribution matches for religious or charitable organizations typically depend on the specific policies of the employer's matching gift program. Here's an overview of how it usually works:

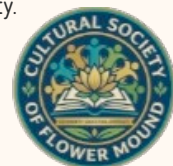
1. Check Eligibility
 - Employers usually provide a list of eligible organizations or categories, such as religious, educational, or nonprofit organizations. Some employers exclude religious organizations unless the donation is for non-religious activities like community outreach or education.
2. Donation by the Employee
 - The employee makes a personal donation to a qualifying religious or charitable organization, like a Hindu temple.
 - The donation amount should meet the employer's minimum requirements (e.g., \$25).
3. Submit Matching Gift Request
 - The employee submits a matching gift request through the company's platform or by filling out a matching gift form.
 - This could include: The donation receipt.
 - Information about the organization (e.g., tax-exempt status like 501(c)(3) in the U.S.).
 - Some companies use platforms like Benevity or Double the Donation to manage these requests.
4. Employer Verification
 - The employer verifies whether the organization and donation meet their eligibility criteria.
 - If approved, the employer matches the donation, usually up to a specified limit (e.g., \$1,000 annually).
5. Funds Disbursed
 - Once approved, the matching amount is sent directly to the organization by the employer.

Important Considerations

- Tax-Exempt Status: Most employers require the organization to have a recognized charitable status, like 501(c)(3) in the U.S.
- Restrictions on Religious Use: Some employers restrict matching to non-religious purposes, like community services or educational programs offered by the religious organization.
- Annual Caps: Employers often have an annual maximum they will match per employee.

To ensure the temple qualifies and the match is successful, check with your HR or your employer's matching gift policy.

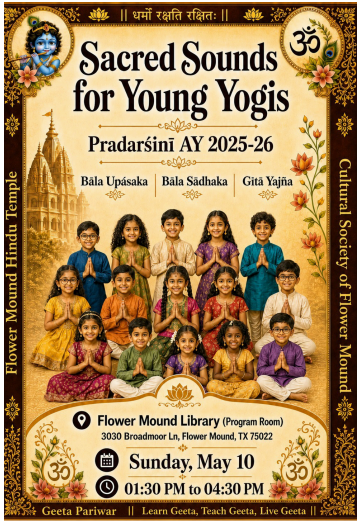
Our event was graced by *44 children* from our classrooms, who received āśīrvādam from more than 65 parents and grandparents present during the program.

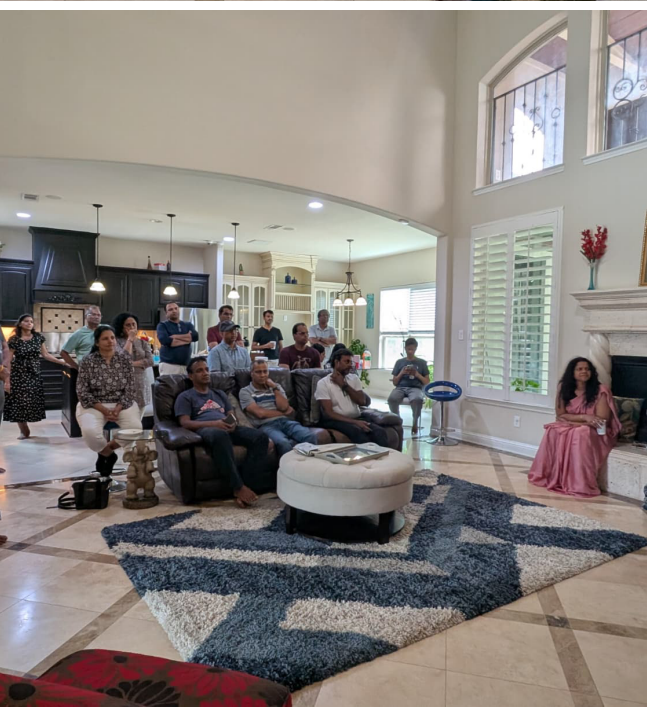
We look forward to seeing the children again in the next academic year and continuing this beautiful journey of Dharma, learning, and sādhana together.
